## Connectors - "Because"

A very common connector in English and in Mvskoke is "because" (or "so", "therefore", etc)

# There are three "styles" for conveying the meaning of "because" or "so"

Sentence Starter: Momekv / Mowekv / Monkv / Onkv

Attached: -ekv / tonkv

After the Verb: tonto /

If starting a sentence, you can use one of the options above to show the meaning of "So..." or "Therefore..."

For this form, you attach -(e)kv to the end of the verb that talks about the 'cause' part. Then, the rest of the sentence follows. It is added after the person marker

This form feels like you are giving more information.
Because of this, one of its many uses is similar to the feeling of "because".

Herekon nohcis. Mv monkv mucv nettv cvkv vnnokke tos.

Herekon nociky mucy netty cyky vnnokke tos.

Herekon noci tonto mucv netty cyky vnnokke tos.

I did not sleep well. So my head hurts today.

I did not sleep well, so my head hurts today.

I did not sleep well, so my head hurts today.

There is also "omecicen", however, this is used in a slightly different way.

Rather than purely "Because" or "So", it means "Because of...", and is

generally followed by a noun or noun phrase:

Estuce omecicen herekon nohcis.

Because of the baby, I didn't sleep well.

Vm mvhayv omecicen sulken keriyis! Because of my teacher, I learned a lot!

### Sentence Starters Momeky / Moweky / Monky / Onky

Each of these stem from the full phrase "Momekv", meaning "Because it is that way / Because it is so"

Over time, some verbs that used "m" in the middle of the word switched to a "w", resulting in "Mowekv"

Monky is a contraction, shortening the middle

Onkv is an even shorter version.

These phrases often appear at the beginning of a sentence, usually following information you already gave to let the listener know what resulted from the previous phrase.

Pose hvkihkvnks. Mowekv hompetvn hvtvm emivnks.

The cat cried. So, I gave him more food.

However, it can also be used in the middle after a T/N connector:

Pose hvkihken monkv hompetvn hvtvm emivnks.

The cat cried, so I gave him more food.

### Attached = eky/tonky

-(e)kv is a conjugation we can add to the end of a verb that is talking about a cause in order to have the feeling of "so/therefore".

1st person singular	"l / me"	"I do so"	ikv / vyekv	Homp <b>ikv</b> / Homp <b>vyekv</b> / eat so
2nd person singular	"You"	"You do, so"	etcekv / etskekv / eccekv / etsekv / eckekv	Homp <b>etcekv</b> (etc)
3rd person singular	"He / She / It / etc"	"He/She/It does so"	ekv	Homp <b>ekv</b> He/She/It eats so
1st person plural	"We"	"We do so"	eyekv / ēkv	Homp <b>ēkv</b> (etc)  We eat so
2nd person plural	"Y'all"	"Y'all do… so"	atcekv / atskekv / accekv / atsekv / ackekv	Homp <b>atcekv</b> Yall eat so
3rd person plural	"They"	"They do so"	akekv*	Homp <b>akekv</b> They eat so

Remember, when tos is used as a helping verb, it looks like:

- Hompe tos
- Nesake tos
- Ayi tos
- Ohhonayetce tos

And this is a very common way of communicating when in conversation

-tonkv is the '-ekv' form on 'tos'. When we use
this form, it has the same meaning, we are
just placing the conjugation on the helping
verb piece

Hompi tonkv	l eatso	
Nesetce tonkv	You buyso	
Aye tonkv	He/She/It goesso	
Ohhonayē tonkv	We readso	

#### -EKV EXAMPLES:

### Vntat taklik-cvmpv nesikv cvmpuce nesetceha?

I am buying the cake, so could you buy the candy?

## Penwv sulken hompetcekv hetute-afke homipetcvs

Because you ate a lot of turkey, don't eat the ice cream.

#### TONKV EXAMPLES

## Fvccv-likat Tvlse vhoyē tonkv hiyowat hompvhanis

We are going to Tulsa at noon, so I am going to eat now

### Vtotke tonkv icenhuehkeko towvnks

He was working, so he didn't call you

### After the Verbs Tonto / Ton Ton

As mentioned before, tonto and ton ton have other uses than "so, therefore, because", but it is one of it's uses! These forms stem from "tos", so think of them as taking the helping verb's place

### Pose hvkihke tonto hompetvn hvtvm emivnks

The cat cried, so I gave him more food

### Vntat taklik-cvmpv nesi ton ton cvmpuce nesetceha?

I'm buying the cake, so could you buy the candy?
