









# IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER



#### The verb is always LAST

- In a full sentence, your verb will always be last
- If you include 'tos' in the sentence, it will always be the VERY LAST word in the sentence



# You HAVE to have a verb in a sentence for it to be a complete sentence

- In fact you only have to have a verb for a full sentence.
- If there is no verb, then it is not a complete sentence



# Remember: We don't always talk in complete sentences

- If someone asks how you are doing, you can answer "Great!" or "Fine!", or if someone asks your name, you can just say your name, not "My name is..."
- This same concept exists in Mvskoke too

### VERB CONJUGATING

#### Present Tense - Using "Hompetv"

- I = Hompi tos
- You = Hompetce tos
- He/She = Hompe tos
- We = Hompē tos
  - Y'all = Hompatce tos
  - They = Hompake tos\*

#### The Many Past Tenses

- Homipis
- Hompvyis
- Hompivnks

- Hompimvts
- Hompivnt(v)s
- Hompvyvtes

#### **Diving into Future Tense**

- There are 2 main conjugations for future tenses
- There are different nuances between the two

## >>> TWO FORMS OF FUTURE TENSE

#### Near Future - vhan

Casual future, intention, or prediction

"I'm going to go to the store"
"I'm going to cook tonight"
"It's going to rain tomorrow"

Usually translates to "going to"



#### General Future - vre/vhe

 Statements of what will or shall be, a promise/pledge, general future

"The tree will grow tall"
"I will buy the cake"
"They will have Fourth Sunday this week"

Usually translates to "will"

# VHAN

#### Let's identify the pattern

#### I'm going to...

Hompetv	to eat
Nesetv	to buy
Vyetv	to go
Ohhonayetv	to read

Style 1

Hompvhanis	I'm going to eat
Nesvhanis	I'm going to buy
Ayvhanis	I'm going to go
Ohhonayvhanis	I'm going to read

Hompvhani tos	I'm going to eat
Nesvhani tos	I'm going to buy

Style 2 & 3

Hompvhan towis	I'm going to eat
Nesvhan towis	I'm going to buy



# VHAN

#### Let's look at the pattern for other person forms

#### going to

Hompvhanetces	You are going to eat
Nesvhanetces	You are going to buy
Ayvhanes	She/He is going to go

Style 1

Ohhonayvhanēs	We are going to read
Hompvhanatces	Y'all are going to eat
Nesakvhanes	They are going to buy

Nesvhanetce tos	You're going to buy
Ohhonayvhanē tos	We are going to read

Style 2 & 3

Nesvhan tonces	You're going to buy
Ohhonayvhan towēs	We are going to read

The cat is going to drink milk

Mv yvhikvhances

I'm going to drive the car

Re Kackv ayvhan tos

Are you going to go to Tulsa?

## IMPORTANT REMINDERS

#### Order:

Verb root + vhan + person marker + ending (s, tos) or

Verb root + vhan + ometv conjugated for person

#### **Vhan OR Vran**

- Depending on dialects, some speakers will use 'vhan' and some will use 'vran'
- 'vran' is the less common dialect

Hompvhanis / Hompvhani tos

Hompvhan towis

**Hompvhanis** 

**Hompvranis** 



#### Main Uses

- Casual future, intention, or prediction
- Usually translates to "going to"

"I'm going to go to the store" "I'm going to cook tonight" - intention "It's going to rain tomorrow"

- casual
- prediction



# VRE / VHE

#### Let's identify the pattern

#### I will...

Hompetv	to eat
Nesetv	to buy
Vyetv	to go
Ohhonayetv	to read

Only Style

Hompares	I will eat
Nesahes	I will buy
Ayares	l will go
Ohhonayahes	l will read

Hompare tos	WRONG
Nesahe tos	WRONG

Omety cannot pair with vre/vhe

Hompvre towis	WRONG
Nesvhe towis	WRONG



## VHAN

#### Let's look at the pattern for other person forms

•	
will	

Hompetcvhes	You will eat
Nesetcvres	You will buy
Vyvhes	She/He will go

Only Style

Ohhonayeyvres	We will read
Hompatcvhes	Y'all will eat
Nesvkvhes*	They will buy

- -vre or -vhe can be used and both fairly common
- -vhe might be considered the bit more common dialect at this point in time
- It is not uncommon to drop off the final 's' in casual speech

She will bring bread

Ceyekce towvhes\* / Ceyekcvhes

You will dance tomorrow

Yvhikares

It will rain

Cvmpuce hompatcvre te?

I will be at church

You will dance tomorrow

**Yvhikares** I will sing

It will rain

I will be at church

## IMPORTANT REMINDERS

#### Order:

Verb root + person marker + vre + s ending or, for stative verbs:

- \*Person marker + verb root + vre & s OR
- \*Person marker + verb root + e + towvres

#### Vre OR Vhe

- It's entirely dialect dependent, and both are fairly common
- -vhe would be considered slightly more common

#### Main Uses

- Statements of what will or shall be, a promise/pledge, general future
- Usually translates to "will"

"The tree will grow"
"I will buy the cake"
"They will have Fourth
Sunday this week"

- what will/shall be
- a promise/pledge
- general future

# FORMING QUESTIONS

If we want to form a question for the future, the way we do it changes depending on whether we are using Future 1 (vhan) or Future 2 (vre/vhe).

We will learn the most common way to form a question for each form of the future:

#### **VHAN**

Add 'v' instead of 's'

Eskvhanetces → Eskvhanetcv?

Hompvhanēs → Hompvhaneyv?

Yvhikvhanis → Yvhikvhanvyv? /

Yvhikvhaniyv?

#### VRE / VHE

Add 'te' instead of 's'

Esketcvhes → Esketcvhe te?

Hompeyvres → Hompeyvre te?

Yvhikares → Yvhikare te?



# FORMING NEGATIVES

Adding negatives in future tense is rather simple, as we follow the rules that many other forms follow.

Here are examples to follow when remembering the pattern for placing the negative 'eko' in your sentence:

#### VHAN

Add '(e)ko' after the person marker

Eskvhanetces → Eskvhanetcekos

Hompvhanēs → Hompvhaneyeko tos\*

Yvhikvhanis → Yvhikvhanakos /

Yvhikvhanako tos

#### **VRE / VHE**

Add 'ek' before 'vre/vhe'

Esketcvhes → Esketcekvhes

Hompeyvres → Hompeyekvres

Yvhikares → Yvhikakvres
