COOKING RECIPE SET UP

When reading or writing a recipe we won't use the <u>vs</u> command form. We use the <u>vs</u> at times when we are present with the person and giving them a direct command. Instead, we use partial sentences with sequential H-grade.

Okcvnwv hakkuce hvmken vpahyet.

Add one tablespoon of salt.

Root word H-grade Partial Sentence (Vpvyetv) Sequential Piece Ending

In our recipes they are set up in a sequential order. So, basically this is not present tense, past tense nor is it future tense. Rather just an instructional statement, made by using H grade.
